Introductions

Residents advised that the new venue for the Local Area Group Meetings (LAG), will be Harrow Road Community Centre. These will take place from the 18th January 2010 at 2pm.

Update on priorities

PC Silverwood asked residents if they wish to keep the current priorities as listed below

Cycling on the Pavement – Derby Road

This issue was discussed and Melanie Futer also spoke about a new scheme, which will provide new and improved cycle routes for University and QMC staff and visitors. However, residents agreed that this priority could now be closed.

Drug dealing in the Penn Avenue area

PC Silverwood advised that this is an ongoing priority as there is still a problem with drugs around the area of Penn Avenue.

Dog Fouling

PC Silverwood and the residents agreed to keep this as an ongoing priority as it was still a big problem within the Wollaton Park estate.

PC Silverwood advised that a Dog Fouling operation had been conducted on the 29th and 30th September 2009 however with a negative result.

Melanie Futer advised that the University were working alongside the Council to provide bins and signs for the Jubilee Campus playing fields.

PC Silverwood advised that CCTV was to be viewed in order to identify offenders.

PC Silverwood advised that a further Dog Fouling Operation is to be run to target offenders. A date is yet to be decided.

Door Knockers

PC Silverwood advised that the extra patrols and target hardening which had been conducted within the area had hopefully moved on the Door Knockers, which had been operating in the area.

PC Silverwood also advised that a meeting is to be planned to try and make Wollaton Park estate a 'No Cold Calling Zone'. Statistics to date had been provided to Trading Standards and is now just waiting a meeting date.

PC Silverwood has also arranged for more 'No Cold Calling' stickers to be distributed at the Bluecoat School coffee morning.

Issues from the local community

A resident advised that graffiti was becoming a problem again in the area.

- CPO Doherty advised he would contact his colleague at Wollaton station to arrange removal.

Orston Drive

- PC Silverwood advised residents that Roads Policing had been informed of the issues with speeding vehicles along Orston Drive
- A response from the Council regarding the erection of signs and road markings was read out to the residents. Justine Ramowski advised that speed humps would be required if a 20mph sign was erected.
- The sign on Charnock Avenue & Orston Drive saying 'No Through Road' is to be replaced.
- PC Silverwood advised residents that should they see any speeding vehicles, they should try and obtain the vrm.

Miscellaneous Issues

PC Silverwood advised residents that a total of 20 addresses were searched for drugs across Wollaton Park. PC Silverwood also advised that enquiries were still ongoing.

PC Silverwood advised residents of 2 recent arrests for autocrime offences as a result of fingerprints found on a vehicle, which had been stolen from Triumph Road.

PC Silverwood and the residents discussed ongoing issues relating to parking along Sutton Passeys Crescent. PC Silverwood advised that the SNT were issuing warning notices advising offenders not to park at certain locations. PC Silverwood also advised residents that if the vehicles were displaying a QMC 'pass' the details of the vehicle would be passed onto PC Draycott who is the Beat Manager for the QMC.

Residents spoke about a Resident Parking Scheme for Sutton Passeys Crescent and Tony Sutton is to liase with Scott Harrison in Traffic Management regarding this.
